Cameron played 60's guitar rock in a HS band...well, in the 60's. He retired when the Beatles broke up and only listened to jazz and classical for 25 years in protest.

Then all of a sudden "middle age crazy" happened and the inevitable new rock band interest. His first come-back calling was in the early 1990's with a reformed old high school band called Retro Rock. And they didn't play new stuff.

During that period Retro Rock opened for the legendary Mike Bruce. Mike had played with BB King, Bobby Blue Bland and finally with Bob Seger. Mike became his mentor and guitar teacher and only then did he start learning how to play the instrument that initially looked easy.



The musical journey from old rock back to blues started here and he became a die-hard blues historian and musician.

Beginning in the early 2000's, Cameron formed the first version of what is now called West of the Blues. There have been a few regroupings of the band, but the original vision - blues and old rock - is still intact.

Most people who hear him play, think he sounds like Eric Clapton, but without all that unnecessary talent as extra baggage!
